The oldest pangolin in the world has celebrated his birthday. Pangolins are animals mostly eating ants. They have poor eyesight and great smell, and like to live alone. They have a long sticky tongue, and scales (鱗片) cover most of their body.

Last month, the Taipei Zoo celebrated the birthday of a pangolin, Chuan-pang. It was born at the zoo in 1997. He is the world's oldest pangolin not living in the wild(野外). Every year when Chuan-pang's birthday was coming, the zoo would give him a special birthday meal.

Zookeepers know where all the biggest ants live in the zoo, and will bring Chuan-pang some pieces to give him a special "fresh" treat. Zookeepers also say Chuan-pang is now the age of a grandpa pangolin. His daughter also lives at the zoo. Chuan-pang may be living a long and comfortable life, but pangolins in the wild are very different.

Experts(專家) say pangolins are the most trafficked(非法販運) animals in the world. They are easy to catch and often killed for their meat, and especially for their scales, which is used in some types of traditional medicines. They do not run very fast and get scared easily. When they feel in danger, they will roll up into a ball to protect themselves with their scales. This makes it easy for a human hunter to simply pick them up and kill them. Some species of pangolin are listed as critically(危急地) endangered(瀕臨絕種的), meaning they are close to disappearing from the wild.
